

# The TW Steel Dmax 2015 Enduro Championships Round 10 – Daytona Milton Keynes

## Light Heat 1

Kameron Khan held on to pole at the start with Jake Butler and Matthew Bees nipping at his heels into turns 2 and 3. Butler grabbed the lead into turn 10 as Khan went defensive into 9, costing him momentum. Bees followed through but Khan regained 2<sup>nd</sup> with a move up the inside at the following corner. Bees got back into 2<sup>nd</sup> on lap 2, dropping Khan to 3<sup>rd</sup>. Cameron Rodger was a second back in 4<sup>th</sup> with Tom Golding on his rear bumper, but lost out to Golding on lap 4. Golding then set after Khan in 3<sup>rd</sup>, closing the gap as he left Chris Hackworth behind with Ben Leslie and Richard Lacey. Leslie was a man on a mission however, moving his way in front of Hackworth and quickly catching Khan and Golding as Khan's defending slowed them up. Leslie was through into 3<sup>rd</sup> at turn 10 on lap 6 but had 3.4 seconds to make up to Bees in 2<sup>nd</sup> with 2 laps to go. Butler took the win, 2.309 seconds clear of Bees. Leslie came home in 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of Golding and Hackworth.

### **Heavy Heat 1**

Robert Pettitt led the field away as the green lights came on with Shaun Bristow and Rob Bennett on his rear bumper. There was an incident at turn 4 as a driver spun out, collecting Tomasz Zaustowicz. George Dutfield moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> on the opening lap and was just a kart length behind Pettitt before taking the lead on lap 2. Bennett followed through to take 2<sup>nd</sup> by the end of the lap, but had over a second to close to get up to Dutfield. Jamie Pender was steadily working his way up the order, getting into 3<sup>rd</sup> and closing on Bennett as Bennett dropped 3 tenths to Dutfield on lap 4.







Stuart Foster was into 4<sup>th</sup> and had a cushion of nearly 4 seconds over the battle for 5<sup>th</sup> between Pettitt, Lee Witney and Bristow. Bennett was closing back up to Dutfield and was towing Pender along with him. Dutfield took the chequered flag by 0.275 seconds from Bennett and Pender with Foster and Witney completing the top 5.s

#### **Inters Heat 1**

Luke Cousins held off the rest of the pack at the start, leading the field around. Simon Gibson was sitting in 2<sup>nd</sup>, 0.884 seconds behind by the end of lap 1 with a comfortable gap of 2 second back to Stuart Gough. The field became spread out unusually early as Allan Curtis ran in 4<sup>th</sup>, a second ahead of Trundley and 1 and a half seconds behind Gough who set a new fastest lap on lap 3. Trundley closed the gap in two laps to catch and then pass Curtis at the final corner with Chris Alcock following him past, only for Curtis to immediately regain the position. Cousins took the win in heat 1 from Gough, Gibson, Trundley and Alcock.

## **Lights Heat 2**

George Hucknall and Ade Holder headed the pack into turn 1 with Joseph Conroy quickly moving up into the lead by turn 5. Conroy built a decent gap on lap 1, completing the opening lap 1.209 seconds clear of James Baldwin and Hucknall. Andrew Hunt was running in 4<sup>th</sup> with Tom Sibley on his rear bumper, losing 4<sup>th</sup> to Sibley on lap 2 as Baldwin set a new fastest lap as he chased down Conroy. Baldwin took the lead on lap 3 as the leading pair enjoyed a 2 second lead over Hucknall and Sibley with Ben Leslie continuing his good form to catch and pass Hucknall. Leslie was onto Sibley within a matter of corners and was pushing him for 3<sup>rd</sup> place as they dropped Hucknall. Leslie was into 3<sup>rd</sup> at the final corner on lap 6 but now had 4 seconds to close down to take 2<sup>nd</sup> from Conroy and only had 2 laps. Baldwin claimed the win in heat 2, leading home Conroy by 3.209 seconds with Leslie, Sibley and Tom Golding on the final lap, taking 3<sup>rd</sup>, 4<sup>th</sup> and 5<sup>th</sup> respectively.

### **Heavy Heat 2**

Paul Gardner found himself on pole in heat 2, but was quickly passed by Adam Christopher who moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of Stuart Foster at turn 1 and then into the lead at turn 4. Foster moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> with Jack Dutfield into 3<sup>rd</sup> by the end of lap 1. Christopher was holding onto the lead, keeping the gap to Foster around 8 tenths as Jack and George Dutfield began to scrap for 3<sup>rd</sup> place with Jamie Pender and Rob Bennett joining them by the end of lap 4. Bennett was looking for a really good points haul from the heats in order to catch Tomasz Zaustowicz for 2<sup>nd</sup> in the Championship. Christopher and Foster were matching each other for lap times at the front as Jack Dutfield continued to hold on to 3<sup>rd</sup>, but Foster closed the gap down on the penultimate lap to start the final lap just 0.397 seconds apart. Pender had taken 4<sup>th</sup> from George Dutfield with the move allowing







Jack Dutfield to get a good gap. Christopher kept Foster behind to take the win by 0.335 seconds from Jack Dutfield, Pender and Robert Pettitt.

Allan Curtis was into 2<sup>nd</sup> on lap 2 but could not quite match Trundley for pace as Trundley began to disappear up the road. Stuart Gough was into 3<sup>rd</sup> but had Chris Alcock and Luke Cousins closing in on him as Trundley posted a new fastest lap. Alcock started the final lap on Gough's rear bumper as Trundley and Curtis continued to pull away at the front. Trundley took the win from Curtis as Alcock got the better run to the line to steal 3<sup>rd</sup> by 0.008 seconds with Gough settling for 4<sup>th</sup> ahead of Cousins.

## **Light Heat 3**

Ollie Ursell got off to a fast start, comfortably leading the field through the first corner. Ben Leslie had a strong opening lap and was on the back of Ursell as they completed the opening lap. Tom







Golding was just 2 tenths behind them and the fastest man on the opening lap. Leslie took the lead on lap 2 with Golding and Peterson Lim following him through into 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> respectively. Golding needed solid points to beat Hackworth to the championship with 21 points separating the two of them in Hackworth's favour. Joseph Conroy served a penalty on lap 3 for an advantage by contact as Leslie gapped the field on lap 4 as those behind tripped over each other, enjoying a 3 second lead over Peterson Lim in 2<sup>nd</sup> until James Baldwin moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> on lap 5. Baldwin put his foot down, setting a 1:05.593 – a new fastest lap – closing the gap to Leslie, but with 3.7 seconds still to claw back with two laps remaining, it was going to be a tall order. Leslie took the win from Baldwin by 3.013 seconds with Baldwin setting another fastest lap on the final lap. Golding, Lim and Ursell rounded out the top 5.

# **Heavy Heat 3**

Jamie Pender and Lee Witney were cleanly away from the front row as the field made it around the opening corner without incident and disappeared down the hill. As they re-emerged, it was Pender from Tomasz Zaustowicz, Lee Witney and Stuart Foster with a gap of 1.4 seconds between Zaustowicz and Witney. Zaustowicz was quick to close the gap to Pender at the front with Zaustowicz setting a new fastest lap in his pursuit of Pender. Foster was dropping back in 3<sup>rd</sup> and had Rob Bennett and Lee Witney dicing for position right behind him. Zaustowicz got to within 4 tenths of Pender and began looking for a way through with the pair now 4 seconds out in front. Zaustowicz was pushing Pender with the pair separated by 0.054 seconds as they started the final lap. Pender held on to win from Zaustowicz with Foster getting back ahead of Bennett to take 3<sup>rd</sup> ahead of Bennett and Adam Christopher.

Chris Alcock moved into 2<sup>nd</sup> on the opening lap and was just 0.161 seconds behind Pointer as they started lap 2 with Bentley and Jonathan Purton half a second behind them. Bentley closed the gap back up and was hassling Alcock for 2<sup>nd</sup>, allowing Pointer to pull a kart length. Bobby Trundley was moving up the order with a new fastest lap set by Trundley on lap 3. Despite the pressure from behind, Alcock moved into the lead as Trundley had a storming lap 5 to move into 2<sup>nd</sup>, 2.5 seconds behind leader, Alcock. Trundley chased the gap down, putting together a string of fastest laps but lost out to Alcock by 0.500 as Alcock took the win ahead of Trundley, Pointer, Bentley and Purton.

# Finals Lights

Ben Leslie led the final Lights Final of 2015 into turn 1 with James Baldwin tucked up under his exhaust. Tom Golding was also in the fight in 3<sup>rd</sup> as they completed the first lap with 7 tenths between them. Jake Butler was into 4<sup>th</sup> ahead of Chris Hackworth as Golding moved into the lead at the final corner on lap 5, but Leslie took the place back at turn 5 on the following lap as Hackworth set a new fastest lap in 5<sup>th</sup>, just 3 tenths behind Butler. Golding regained the lead once more to finish lap 6 1 second clear of Baldwin as Baldwin moved ahead of Leslie with Leslie now being caught by Butler and Hackworth. Golding and Baldwin were trading fastest laps as the time ticked away with Baldwin now starting to get some momentum and getting the gap down to 0.388 seconds. This allowed Baldwin to start attacking Golding with a run up the hill seeing Golding go defensive into turn 9 giving Baldwin the inside line for turn 10 as he held on around the outside. Golding gave Baldwin room into turn 10 and performed the cut back, regaining the lead into turn 11 as they started the penultimate lap just 0.117 seconds apart. Golding pushed as hard as he could and held on to take the win from Baldwin by 0.399 seconds with Leslie completing the podium a further 3.577 seconds behind. Butler came home in 4<sup>th</sup> with Hackworth doing enough in 5<sup>th</sup> for the 2015 TW Steel DMAX Lights Heats Championship.

#### **Heavies**

Jamie Pender and Stuart Foster headed the field for the final time in 2015 as they got away cleanly. Rob Bennett was into 5<sup>th</sup> at the start but claimed two more spots on the first lap to take up 3<sup>rd</sup> place as Pender pushed to take his second win of the day. Foster was a second back by the end of lap 1 with Bennett a further 7 tenths back. Bennett appeared to be the faster driver as he closed in on Foster and passed him for 2<sup>nd</sup> on lap 3 with Pender using the time they lost to extend his lead to 2.343 seconds over Bennett and Foster. Bennett was pushing however, lapping faster than Pender as George Dutfield now in 3<sup>rd</sup>, set a new fastest lap to close in on Bennett with Bennett now looking as though he would have to defend 2<sup>nd</sup> instead of attacking for 1<sup>st</sup>. Pender was looking clear at the front and just paced himself to the chequered flag, winning by 0.705 seconds as Bennett set a new fastest lap on the final lap and came home in 2<sup>nd</sup> ahead of Dutfield with Foster and Adam Christopher rounding out the top 5.

### **Inters**

Bobby Trundley made the most from pole and got away cleanly to head Chris Alcock at the start. Alcock had a terrible first lap, dropping out of 2<sup>nd</sup> and pulling into the pitlane. Trundley completed the first lap with a 2.3 second lead with Luke Cousins now into 2<sup>nd</sup> place ahead of Stuart Gough and Allan Curtis. Trundley was untroubled at the front and free to stretch his legs as he pulled away. Trundley was lapping half a second quicker than everyone else on circuit as Curtis was trying to get within striking distance of Gough in front of him as he lapped just 4 tenths behind him. Adam Pointer and Simon Gibson were racing for 7<sup>th</sup> with Pointer getting ahead on lap 6. Curtis was edging closer towards the back of Gough's kart but was still not quite close enough to make a move for the final podium position as Trundley continued to pull away at the front with his lead out to 5 seconds







after 8 laps. Curtis made his move for 3<sup>rd</sup> on the final lap into turn 6, but Gough came back at him with Curtis trying to get back at him. The chequered flag greeted Trundley, giving him the final win of the year from Cousins by 5.908 seconds. A move around the outside of the final corner nearly paid off Curtis as he and Gough both raced towards the line side by side with Gough just taking it by 0.022 seconds. Curtis had to settle for 4<sup>th</sup> with Gibson completing the top 5.
