

Daytona DMAX Endurance Champs 2017 Round 1 – Daytona Milton Keynes

Inter Enduro Qualifying

The Daytona DMAX Championships roared into life as 30 Inters Enduro drivers fired up their engines ready to leave the pit-lane for their 15 minute qualifying session.

Reigning Champion Bobby Trundley showed everyone how not to do it early on with spins at consecutive corners as he tried to warm his tyres and test the track conditions! As the drivers warmed their tyres, the lap-times dropped and Bobby Trundley was soon in the groove, moving to top of time sheets with 1:06.290, with Nuno Costa chasing him 4 tenths behind and Chris Hackworth another 64 thousandths behind. Mike Coppin and Tim McKeegan were trading lap-times for fourth before Oli Peacock leap-frogged them both.

With two minutes to go, Mike Coppin was up to second on the grid and as the chequered flag fell, Trundley held on to Pole for the first race of the year with Coppin beside him, and Costa and Peacock on row two.

Hackworth and Ryan line up on row three, Curtis and Kirk on row four and Cousins and McKeegan rounded off the top ten.

Race

Trundley converted Pole into the lead with Coppin chasing him into T2. Oli Peacock attacks for second place at T5 but drops to P4. Former DMAX Champion, Hackworth showed his class moving up to 3rd from 5th on the first lap, attacking Coppin for P2. Peacock consolidates fourth place with five kart lengths lead over Costa and Ryan. Matthewe Bennett spins at T5 and drops to last.

Phillip Senior clipped a kerb and risked sprocket damage with the Race Observers reporting a possible pit stop required but he remained out in the hope the damage would not stop his race.

After five minutes, a long train of karts followed Allan Curtis in 8th place, with 12 drivers looking for a way past. McKeegan and Kirk were the first pair in the train fighting behind him for 9th. With everyone behind in a battle for position, Trundley extended his lead to 4.47 seconds with a fastest lap of 1:05.794s as he comes up to lap Peter Blackburn.

At 9 minutes in, Peacock, Costa and Ryan battled hard for fourth but as they lapped Peter Blackburn, Peacock sneaked past Coppin to take P3 and Ryan beat Costa into T5.

As we reached quarter distance, Trundley led by 8 seconds, from Hackworth, who led Peacock by 2.4 seconds. Coppin remained less than a second behind Peacock, with Ryan on his rear bumper.

Further back Xander Mahony was having a poor start to his Inters Championship year, battling with Tempest, Cook and Senior for 21st place on the busy International Circuit at Daytona Milton Keynes. All thirty drivers looking for space on the circuit.

At 20 minutes in, Mahony was spun by Curtis, after Curtis was clipped by another kart. The Race Observers judged Curtis to be blameless and no penalty given.

Nesbitt and Bourke were both warned for kerbing at 25 minutes into the race. In one hour endurance racing, drivers need to find a balance between sprinting and looking after their kart to ensure that they reach the chequered flag.

Trundley extended his lead to 14 seconds at lap 24, but Peacock was only 0.5 seconds ahead of Hackworth. Coppin was lapping just 1.5 seconds behind Hackworth and Costa just 1.8 seconds further back. As the leaders came around to lap Mahony, Hackworth saw an opportunity to get past Peacock and challenged him for second. It didn't come off but it was





good opportunistic driving. Coppin meanwhile had a bad lap 28 and dropped to 6th place. McKeegan was holding on to 7th but with Kirk just 0.3 seconds behind.

Curtis was holding Cousins back with Edmondson-Jones and Perry battling them both for 9th.

Hackworth passed Peacock for second on lap 30 but immediately lost the place back. And then took it back again on lap 32. Costa sat right on their tails desperate for a podium finish.

At 36 minutes in Ryan also closed on the battle for third.

Peter Blackburn managed to lose this timing TXP and had to Pit to have it replaced. In accordance with champs regs, his unrecorded laps were added back but he lost out the time taken to pit to refit the transponder.

Trundley's dominance continued with a 23 second lead at 45 minutes in. Meanwhile the battle for second continued and intensified as the four drivers came through to lap tailmarkers.

At turn 2, as they scrabbled to get past Shearman, Costa clipped the back of Coppin's kart putting him into a spin. Costa picked up a 30 second stop go penalty for the incident and had to pit from the resulting 4th place. Peacock picked up 4th and Coppin managed to recover 5th place.

Costa elected to retire rather than re-join the race. Kirk was now up to 7th but 7 seconds back from Coppin. Meanwhile Ryan snuck past Hackworth on lap 44 to take second place and then help him one second behind him. Coppin passed Peacock for 4th place with the two of them just under three seconds behind Hackworth.

At 50 laps completed and with less than 5 minutes to go, Trundley's lead was 27.150 seconds and Ryan had managed to extend the gap to Hackworth to 2.7 seconds.

As the last lap sign went out, Trundley was 29 seconds clear and one lap later he won by 29.123 seconds. Ryan held on to second ahead of Hackworth, with Coppin beating Peacock for 4th. McKeegan and Kirk were split by just 0.125 seconds at the line for 6th place.

Heavy Enduro

Qualifying





With one driver not making it to Registration on time, just 29 drivers lined up for the first round of the Daytona DMAX Heavy Endurance Championship.

The circuit opened for qualifying and all 29 drivers headed out to learn the circuit. Once tyres and drivers were warmed up, the early provisional pole went to Tom Pughe, with 1:07.100 just 0.2 ahead of Adrian Wisniewski.

Adam Daly popped to the top of the time sheets for a few seconds before Pughe retook it. Nakar took third on the provisional grid at ten minutes in. Rob Bennett's return to the Championship saw him sitting in 5th for much of qualifying whilst Zaustowicz had to settle for 8th behind Pritchard.

Pughe's local knowledge meant that he was a massive 0.5 seconds head of Wisniewski in second but then the rest of the top ten were split by less than one second.

In the final minute Bennett improved to third, Zaustowicz just behind him in 4th. Haine was sitting in 7th, Witney in 8th, Pritchard in 9th and Almou in 10th.

At the chequered, the grid remained as above, so the front row for the race start would be Pughe and Wisniewksi – both Daytona MK experts.

The Race

All safely through T1, with Pughe leading. Bennett attacked for second, holding Wisniewski up – but the top ten drivers ended Lap 1 in grid order.

Pughe extended his lead to a massive 2.2 seconds after two race laps, but Wisniewksi was racing defensively with Bennett continually attacking for second place. Zaustowicz dropped back and Daly and Nakar were looking for way past the number 2 driver from 2016.

Chris Peberdy passed Munro on lap two for 11th place.

Bennett moved up to second on lap three before Lee Witney tangled with a tailmarker at T1 causing a lengthy full course yellow whilst the marshals recovered Witney from the tyre wall and walked the tailmarker back to the pits.

As the race went back to green, Pughe had a 3 second lead over Bennett, with Wisniewski just 0.9 seconds behind. Zaustowicz held on to fourth, opening a one second gap over Daly who enjoyed a lot of space behind as Nakar had slowed to 3 seconds further back. Pritchard was having a great race in 7th with clear air behind him before Almou and Haine's battle for 8th.

Chris Munro had recovered 11th and 10th, passing Chris Peberdy and Paul Studd. Whilst at the front, Pughe posted a fastest lap of a 66.033. Daly took fourth from Zaustowicz, on lap 15 before Zaustowicz stole it back on lap 23. Further back Ammendola overcooked it into T10 and spun to lose 12th place.

Further round the circuit a spinning Dan Murphy at T2 caused a worrying moment for Pritchard and Nakar as they were both nearly taken out by the spinning kart.

The various battles around the circuit had to find their way through the traffic, with countless battles in the middle and tail-order as the leaders came round to lap the field for the third time.

At half distance, Pughe's lead was 6.4 seconds from Bennett who was 4.7 seconds ahead of Wisniewski. Zaustowicz form continued to be below par for the 2016 runner up – he was now 8 seconds off third place.

Witney was recovering from his earlier problem with the tail-marker. He was back up to 14th and sensibly allowed Pughe to lap him so that he could follow Pughe through the traffic ahead.





Munro had moved up to 9th and was leading the Super Heavy Class (for drivers over 105kgs). Paul Studd was the second Super Heavy Driver, running 11th overall, just 10 seconds behind Munro.

At 35 minutes in, Zaustowicz had closed on Wisniewski and had a chance to take third into T10, but Zaustowicz out braked himself. He managed to slow the kart down enough to get round the corner but lost a lot of time – allowing Daly to pass him for fourth. Daly then closed up on Wisniewksi looking for a podium place.

Daly moved into third on lap 36 but on lap 40, Daly and Wisniewski both out braked themselves allowing the stalking Zaustowicz to sneak through from 5th to 3rd.

Pughe's lead at 46 minutes was 7.881 seconds, with Bennett 17.959 seconds clear of Zaustowicz. Behind Tomek, just 5 seconds split Daly, Wisniewski, Pritchard and Nakar.

With just 8 minutes to go, lots of drivers were finding more grip as the circuit warmed up in the February sunshine. Daly and Wisniewksi swapping fourth place twice on lap 47, with Pritchard closing in on the pair. Pritchard and Daly side by side through T6 and T7. Wisniewski pulls away from Daly as Pritchard and Nakar attack Daly for 5th with Pritchard eventually getting past Daly for 5th at T4.

With 3 minutes to go, Nakar snuck up the inside of Daly into T9 and Daly, unaware that Nakar was there, turned into him, bouncing off the side of Nakar's kart and into the tyre wall at T9. Daly retired following the impact allowing Almou to move up to 7^{th} , Munro up to 8^{th} and Witney up to 9^{th} .

Last Lap shown to Pughe and Bennett, with Wisniewski attacking Zaustowicz for third at T9 and Wisniewski out braking himself so Zaustowicz escapes and Pritchard passes the recovering Wisniewksi for 4th.

At the chequered flag, Pughe wins from Bennett and Zaustowicz. Pritchard takes a well-deserved fourth as Wisniewski rues his late challenge which cost him at least one place.

Qualifying

The circuit opened for the 15 minute qualifying session and 30 drivers headed out – one or two of them a little late to their karts and missed the start of Qualifying. The Championship





Officials making sure that the session started on time despite the tardy drivers not being ready.

After five minutes, Cameron Noble topped the time sheets, from Richard Lacey – but Kameron Khan moved up to 2nd with Graeme Cobb and Harrison Pughe challenging for the top positions.

After ten minutes Noble had held on to pole – 3 tenths clear of Ben Leslie and Graeme Cobb who were split by just 93 thousandths.

Khan takes Provisional Pole with one minute to go — and as the chequered flag went out, he had held on to it ahead of Ben Leslie. With Cameron Noble and Harrison Pughe on row two. Graeme Cobb and Max O'Shaughnessy lined up on row three, with Craft and Parker on row four and Lacey and Dhillon rounding out the top ten.

The Race

After seemingly learning their lesson from the start of qualifying, all thirty drivers were on time for the race start.

Khan leads into T2, Ben Leslie catches the Kerb at T3 and spins from second place – half blocking the circuit and dropping down the order.

Khan, Noble and O'Shaughnessy are the top three at the end of Lap 1. Harrison Pughe is fourth, ahead of Richard Lacey and Dante Dhillon. Leslie ended lap one in 19th.

Josh Craft moved up to 7th on lap four. On lap five, Khan leads by 0.310 seconds from Noble with an amazing three way battle behind them including O'Shaughnessy, Pughe and Lacey. Lacey offers an early over take of the year with a superb high speed pass on Pughe at T9 – meanwhile Leslie recovered up to 11th – passing 8 drivers in four laps.

One lap later, Lacey does it again – passing O'Shaughnessy on T9. Pughe follows him through but three corners later, O'Shaughnessy makes a brutal overtake into T4 – leaving Pughe no space to defend.

Further back Charlotte Manton, who qualified 17th is up to 13th as she learns her way round Daytona MK. Graeme Cobb is down in a lowly 17th after being held up in the first lap incident with Ben Leslie.

Sam Hampshire gets passed by Manton at T2 and Hampshire then loses another two places. Meanwhile Leslie is up to 9th place.

Damian committed to a pass on Dhillon into T9 – which means they are slow up to T11 and Ben Leslie sneaks past both of them to take 7^{th} place in a cheeky move.

Damian, Dhillon and Leslie raced glued together for the next lap with attempted passes a plenty.

Khan does a new fastest lap of 1:04.665 at 15 minutes in. He is just 0.8 seconds ahead of Cameron Noble. Seven seconds further back Lacey is 3 seconds clear of O'Shaughnessy and Pughe who are split by just 0.3 seconds.

One third of the way into the race, Khan's lead was up to 3 seconds from Noble. With Lacey 3 seconds further back - chased by the battling O'Shaughnessy and Pughe.

Leslie's recovery had seen him up to 6th place, with Damian, Craft, Wayne Jnr and Dhillon rounding out the top ten.

Graeme Cobb was up to 11th place 2.5 seconds ahead of Manton. Manton was just 0.2 seconds ahead of Sam Bennett.





At 30 minutes, Leslie passed Pughe through T9 and then closed on O'Shaughnessy. As blue flags went out to help O'Shaughnessy past a tailmarker, Leslie did another amazing pass into T2 completely catching O'Shaughnessy by surprise – and moving into 4th.

With 16 seconds between Leslie and third place Lacey, his recovery would stall for a while. Behind him, the O'Shaughnessy and Pughe battle continued – with Damian closing on them. Craft was 8 seconds behind Damian and 10 seconds ahead of Cobb who was now in 9th.

At two thirds distance, Khan led by 5 seconds but Lacey had closed on Noble – the gap down to one second – before they closed on some lapped drivers. The gap came down further to 0.5 seconds. Khan able to get further ahead, extending to 7 seconds as he lapped the circuit in 1:04.475s.

Leslie's recovery was slowed – the gap ahead still 14 seconds. Further back Daniel Parker was just 0.2 seconds behind Ethan Souter.

Black Flag given to David Glover for contact at T2 at 45 minutes into the race dropping him to 21st.

Lacey and Noble's race for second heated up on lap 44 – the two drivers side by side into T9, T10 and T11. The gap at the start line was just 0.106 seconds.

Lacey passed Noble for second place into T6 on lap 47. Craft spun at T10. But elsewhere Sam Bennett is passed by both Manton and Dillon on lap 47.

With just six minutes to go, Khan did another fastest lap of 1:04.411s – whilst Noble got back ahead of Lacey for second for half a lap before Lacey passed him back again in T6 again.

Lacey then found gaps through the traffic to extend a gap over Noble of 1.5 seconds then got stuck in traffic allowing Noble to close.

Khan won by 11 seconds from Lacey, who finished 2.089 seconds ahead of Noble. Leslie finished fourth, O'Shaughnessy fifth – with Damian passing Pughe on the last lap to steal sixth.
